**Meeting Summary**

**City/County/Agency GIS Programs**

City of Chico – Brad reported that Chico is currently implementing TRAKiT land management software, completing the Geocortex web services, and working on a Websoft based mobile mapping system (MMS). Update of the tree inventory is currently on hold.

South Feather – Agency is currently preparing dredging reports for powerhouses affected by Oroville Dam spillway failure. Leroy reported that they hope to move toward mobile data collection.

Butte County – Jim reported that no major issues have occurred with ArcGIS 10.5 since installation late last year. GIS staff have been testing disconnected editing utilizing Geocortex. Recognized an issue regarding licensing and will continue using ESRI Collector until resolved. Group recommended looking at Survey123 as a possible solution.

Chico State – Darren reported that the server migration is still being implemented. GIC is currently working with Tehama Co to bring base datasets up-to-date and the City of Gridley is exploring a maintenance plan for datasets. Tyler is working on compiling the Butte County Regional Datasets, still needs info from several jurisdictions.

ESRI – Mike informed the group of several upcoming workshops/seminars: Sacramento covering Amazon Web Services; Bay Area – Disaster Planning. ESRI also has a GIS Managers series. The group discussed ideas in regards to the local ESRI user groups and potentially bringing it back, in some form, to the Butte County area.

BCAG – Brian discussed some recent GIS/mapping related projects being overseen by BCAG which include the Butte County Regional PEV Readiness Plan, Sustainable Communities Strategy progress report, and B-Line paratransit web application. BCAG has also applied for a Caltrans grant to create an Oroville Bike Map.

### Parcel Maintenance Update

Group discussed the upcoming transfer of parcel maintenance to the Butte County Assessor's office. July 1<sup>st</sup> will be the official date of the transfer. Chico State will receive a download of the dataset and end users should see no difference. Jim discussed the Parcel Fabric and the Assessor's potential move to the new platform.

### Census LUCA

Brian provided an update of the project and discussed the upcoming review period. Notices and datasets were distributed by the Census Bureau in early April and must be reviewed within a 90 days. A majority of jurisdictions will be completing the review.

Presentation –Brian presented the mapping and analysis completed for the Butte PEV Readiness Plan.
