Meeting Summary

City/County/Agency GIS Programs

City of Oroville – The City is now working on getting ArcGIS Online up and running for several web map application. Jesse explained that they are still working with new data collector applications for weed abatement and tree inventory.

Chico State – Jason explained they are working with local jurisdictions and implementing GIS models for data updates – now exploring the utility model. Broadband data collection is ongoing and Chico is heading up the regional consortium and will be meeting with various agencies to get input on expanding the program. The local vehicle theft pilot project has been implemented.

Butte County – The County is now undergoing an update of all GIS related software – upgraded to ArcGIS 10.5 platform. Jim explained they recently acquired Geocortex and are implementing new web maps. Public Works department is looking at getting data collected for various features such as street signs.

Glenn County – Marty described the new funding mechanism for GIS within the County which has encouraged other departments to utilize the service. Glenn is also looking at utilizing ArcGIS online for some of the web maps. Staff is currently working on inventory of signs and vegetation. County is exploring GIS based pavement management systems/software. An active transportation plan grant from the state was obtained and will help collect bike and pedestrian related infrastructure.

City of Chico – Street sign inventory has been completed. Websoft and the City are still working together to get the updated facilities map completed. City also exploring the use

of Geocortex. New 911 system being implemented and replacing Positron – new system will be used by both police and fire. Butte County is also exploring new system.

Butte College – Facilities director has recently retired and the GIS committee has not been active since. The three departments which are most active with GIS are... Engineering, Geography, and Agriculture.

South Feather – currently conducting an assessment of all facilities following this winters storms. District is working to get power plant at Oroville dam back online.

BCAG – Brian discussed the Census LUCA project which is being coordinated for Butte County – workshop was recently held. Staff is also working on mapping motor vehicle accidents through the SWITRS system – federal government has mandated certain performance measures related to driving and accidents. If FY 17/18 budget is approved, BCAG will be working with Chico State to develop web maps for paratransit services and various capital projects reporting.

North Valley URISA Meeting

Jason provided an overview of URISA and the need for north valley participation. The group discussed some of the benefits associated with URISA and meeting as a north valley collection. Jason is coordinating a meeting/social for the purpose of further discussing.

Regional Data Exchange

The group discussed the regional data exchange. The data is valuable when dealing with multi-jurisdiction incidents like emergencies. Jim noted that some of the data is old and could be updated. Other adjacent counties such as Plumas, Sutter, and Yuba would be worth including.

Presentations – Tyler and Jim presented GIS based web applications which are currently in beta testing.
