



Notice of Preparation of Availability of a Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Report for the 2024 Regional Transportation Plan and Sustainable Communities Strategy

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Butte County Association of Governments (BCAG) is the lead agency has prepared a Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (SEIR) for the 2024 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS).

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: BCAG has developed a 2024 update to the 2020 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and Sustainable Communities Strategy (SCS) to guide future transportation projects and to facilitate a land use scenario for the region that is consistent with the requirements of Senate Bill 375 (SB 375).

PROJECT LOCATION: The geographical extent of the proposed 2024 RTP-SCS includes the area within the limits of Butte County, California, including the incorporated cities of Biggs, Chico, Gridley, Oroville, and Paradise, and all unincorporated areas under the jurisdiction of the County of Butte. The attached figure shows the 2024 RTP/SCS plan area.

PUBLIC HEARING AND COMMENT: BCAG is soliciting comments on the adequacy and completeness of the analysis and proposed mitigation measures described in the Draft 2024 RTP/SCS Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (SEIR), which is a supplement to the 2020 RTP Program SEIR (State Clearinghouse #2015092038). You may comment by submitting written comments to BCAG prior to the close of public comment which ends on November 4, 2024 at 5:00 p.m.

PROJECT DETAILS: The proposed project is the Butte County 2024 RTP/SCS, which updates BCAG's previous 2020 RTP adopted in December 2020. BCAG, as both the federally-designated metropolitan planning organization (MPO) and the State-designated regional transportation planning agency (RTPA) for Butte County, is required by both federal and State law to prepare a long-range (at least 20-year) transportation planning document known as a Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). The RTP is an action-oriented document used to achieve a coordinated and balanced regional transportation system. California Government Code Section 65080 et seq. and Title 23 United States Code (USC) Section 134 require Regional Transportation Planning Agencies (RTPA) and MPO to prepare long-range transportation plans to: 1) establish regional goals, 2) identify present and future needs, deficiencies and constraints, 3) analyze potential solutions, 4) estimate available funding, and 5) propose investments. State Statutes require that the RTP serve as the foundation for the short-range transportation planning documents: the Regional and Federal Transportation Improvement Programs (RTIP and FTIP).

The 2024 RTP/SCS is the long-range planning, policy, action, and financial document for the Butte County Region. The RTP/SCS covers a 20-year period from 2024 to 2045 and is an update of the 2020 RTP/SCS. The RTP/SCS identifies the region's transportation needs and issues and sets forth actions, programs, and projects to address those needs and issues. The RTP/SCS adopts policies, sets goals, and identifies financial resources to encourage and promote the safe and efficient management, operation, and development of a regional intermodal transportation system that would serve the mobility needs of goods and people. As described above, BCAG does not propose any land use changes, but rather the land use patterns envisioned by the RTP/SCS are based on the General Plan land use and zoning designations of the local agencies (the five incorporated cities and the county). The RTP/SCS would be consistent with the land use and zoning designations in the incorporated and unincorporated areas. The

2024 RTP/SCS reflects changes in legislative requirements, local land use policies, and resource constraints since the most recent RTP/SCS was adopted on December 14, 2020. The 2024 update to the RTP/SCS is focused on implementation of the 2020 RTP/SCS, with minor updates to ensure consistency with federal, state and local planning requirements.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW FINDINGS: BCAG has prepared a Draft SEIR pursuant to requirements of the State Guidelines for the Implementation of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). The SEIR has been prepared because of the potential for unavoidable, significant adverse effects resulting from program implementation. The SEIR prepared for the 2024 RTP/SCS identifies and discusses potential impacts, mitigation measures, residual impacts, and monitoring requirements for issue areas that were not previously covered by the 2020 SEIR or for which the 2024 RTP/SCS would have different impacts than were previously analyzed in the 2020 SEIR. In accordance with CEQA Guidelines Section 15087(c)(6), the proposed project would not occur on known hazardous sites enumerated under Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

If the project description changes, BCAG will require a reevaluation of the SEIR to consider the changes. If you challenge this environmental document in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues raised by you or others in written correspondence or in hearings on the proposed 2024 RTP/SCS.

HOW TO COMMENT: Because of the time sensitive nature of the regional transportation planning process, we request your response at the earliest possible date. If representing an agency, please identify the agency name and appropriate contact name, phone number, and email address. Comments from the public must include name, phone number, and email or postal address. Please limit comments to environmental issues evaluated in the Draft SEIR such as traffic, biology, noise, etc. You will receive notice of the dates of future public meetings to consider project approval or denial. BCAG is expected to consider certification of the SEIR and approval of the 2024 RTP/SCS at its board meeting on December 12, 2024. The meeting will start at 9:00 a.m. at the BCAG Board Room, 326 Huss Drive, Suite 100, Chico, California, 95928.
